**English:** Stories in familiar settings, Letters, Humorous Poems and Classic Poems, Traditional Tales, Information Texts.

Learn how to use punctuation correctly, including capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks. Learn how to use sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command. Use expanded noun phrases to describe and specify, e.g. adjectives to describe nouns. Develop our comprehension and reading skills in guided reading.

**Maths:** Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens, ones). Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens, ones). Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations, including the number line. Add and subtract numbers using a range of strategies e.g. concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally. Recognise, find, name and write fractions 1/3, 1/4, 2/4 and 3/4 of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity. Recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p); combine amounts to make a particular value. Solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change.

**Science:** We will learn facts and key vocabulary that will help us to compare and group different kinds of rocks based on their appearance and physical properties (Igneous, Sedimentary and Metamorphic rocks), as well as how they are useful to us.

We will look at and explain how fossils were formed. We will investigate and compare different types of soils and how they are made.

**Computing:** Navigating files and saving.

Using graphic design tools. Laying out a document and using word processing programs.
