- NPECTS TA completed training and leads competitive Sports
- High participation levels in curriculum P.E.
- Cluster Sports Council established and attended.
- Links to outside clubs increased: King's Lynn Community Football, Mini- Gear, Dersingham Cricket Club (Chance to Shine),
- Increase in different sports taught, quik sticks hockey, tag rugby.
- Increase in different competitions entered (Tag Rugby) and (Quik Sticks)
- Represented West Norfolk in Quik Sticks, Cross Country & netball, Tri-Golf
- Fitness levels of pupils at Snettisham are improving as a result of our involvement with Edufit.
- Children's engagement in physical activity is increasing and we are on track to have more pupils entering the mini-GEAR than last year.
- SSCo taught alongside staff in school to develop skills.
