#### Impact of funding 2016-17

- Sainsbury Gold Award achieved Summer 2017 (2<sup>nd</sup> year running)
- New format sports day which involved greater child participation (and parent!)
- NPECTS TA completed training and leads competitive Sports
- High participation levels in curriculum P.E.
- Cluster Sports meetings attended.
- Links to outside clubs increased: King's Lynn Community Football, Mini- Gear, Dersingham Cricket Club (Chance to Shine),
- Increase in different sports taught, quik sticks hockey, tag rugby.
- Increase in different competitions entered (Tag Rugby) and (Quik Sticks)
- · Represented West Norfolk in Cross Country.
- Fitness levels of pupils at Snettisham are improving as a result of our involvement with Edufit. (see reports)
- · Children's engagement in physical activity is increasing
- We won £800 at the mini-GEAR this year as small school with most finishers!.
- SSCo taught alongside staff in school to develop skills.
- New P.E. co-ordinator (secondary trained P.E. teacher)
