English:

Stories in familiar settings, Letters, Poems and Traditional Tales, Information Texts.

We will be learning how to use punctuation correctly, including capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks. We will learn how to use sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation and command. We will develop our comprehension and reading skills in guided reading. We will continue with phonics to support our reading and writing.

Maths:

We will be counting and representing numbers to 100, looking at place value. We will add and subtract numbers using different methods. We will begin to look at multiplication and division.

We will be using equipment and mental strategies when doing our maths questions and problem solving.

We will look at 2D and 3D shapes, identifying their names and properties.

We will look at money, identifying notes and coins, how to use the correct signs and how to combine amounts to make a particular value.

Science:

Plants

We will be identifying different plants and trees, labelling their parts. We will look at parts of a flower and see if we can identify them. We will be observing plants, how they grow and change from bulbs. We will find out what plants need to grow well and how they survive in different areas.

Computing:

Espresso coding.

Use the internet safely to retrieve information.

MFL:

Spanish – greetings (name, how old are you?), numbers 1-12, months of the year (birthdays), days of the week, colours, body parts, instructions.

History:
