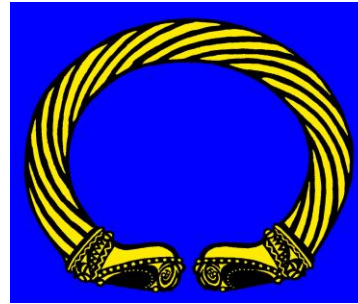
Term: Spring Term 2018

English:

Books by the same author, Stories with an element of fantasy, Non Chronological reports, Recounts.

Develop our comprehension and reading skills in guided reading. Learn how to use punctuation correctly, including capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.

Learn how to use sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command. Use expanded noun phrases to describe and specify, e.g. adjectives to describe nouns. Develop use and understanding of verbs and direct speech.

History:

We will be learning about the Mayans, working out how long ago they lived, researching their culture and using the drawings of Frederick Catherwood to draw conclusions about their life.

Geography:

We will be using a map to identify compass points (N, S, E, W), locate specific countries, cities and rainforests around the world. We will be comparing weather in different parts of the world. We will learn about the Amazon rainforest (comparing it to our local area, how rainforests have changed over time and deforestation).

Art and design:

We will be looking at animals that can be found in rainforests and creating a display based on this. We will also look at Mayan artwork and create our own pieces.

Design & Technology:

We shall be exploring our Science topic further through cookery and observing the effects of heating, cooling and baking.

RE: What is worship?

We will look at how 3 different religions (Hinduism, Christianity and Buddhism) carry out worship. We will focus on their use of prayer, music, festivals and symbolic symbols.

Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations, including the number line, Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use <, > and = signs, Solve problems, including missing number problems, using number facts, place value, and more complex addition and subtraction Add and subtract numbers mentally, including a 3-digit number and ones; a 3-digit number and tens and a 3-digit number and hundreds, Compare and sort common 2-D and 3-D shapes and everyday objects

Science:

We will be learning about different types of materials including man-made and natural (how they can be grouped and what they are used for). We will investigate states of matter and looking at reversible and irreversible changes. We will observe the effects of heating and cooling as well as solid, liquid and gases and how temperature plays a part in this progress.

Computing:

Navigating files and saving them within a directory. Using word processing programs and presentation programs to organise and structure work.
