Starting School

Please help us and encourage your child to become independent by...

- Dressing and undressing unaided
- ✓ Using a knife, fork and spoon correctly
- Using the toilet and washing hands independently
- Fasten their coat and shoes
- Hold a pencil correctly/recognise & write their own name
- Cut with scissors

Bookbags

Please could children have and bring their book bag to school on a daily basis. They will keep books, home learning packs and letters in these so useful to have so they don't have their hands full!

Book bags can be purchased from <u>Sew on & Sew Forth</u> (Hunstanton).

They will be kept in their own named tray. Sometimes useful to have a recognisable keyring on.

Uniform

Black shoes – try to avoid laces! PLEASE LABEL EVERYTHING ©

Embrioded uniform (e.g. jumpers and cardigans) can be purchased from 'Sew on and Sew Forth' in Hunstanton.

PE Kit

Please have a PE kit bag with the following:

- White t-shirt
- Navy/black shorts
- Plimsoles (indoor) trainers (outdoor)
- Jogging bottoms/jumper (outdoor)
- Spare socks

The children keep these in school on their peg and we will send them home every few weeks for a wash!

Snacks and Water Bottles

The children will have a free fruit snack during the morning.

Children need to bring a named water bottle daily that can be refilled (please <u>water only</u> at school).



Lunches

- Children can choose hot option, vegetarian, jacket potato or school packed lunch
 - Or you can provide a healthy packed lunch from home (please no food items that contain nuts due to allergies in school)
- Please discuss with your child what they will be having for lunch
- The children complete a lunch chart in the morning in the classroom

Early Years Foundation Stage

- Each of the 7 areas of learning has its own set of <u>'Early</u> <u>Learning Goals</u> which determine what most children are expected to achieve by the <u>end</u> of the Reception year.
- Progress is recorded throughout the year. This is made up of notes, pieces of the children's work and annotated photographs. Plus teacher knowledge of the child.
- There are 17 Early Learning Goals altogether. At the end of the year each of these goals is given a score of 1,2,or3 depending on whether the child is assessed as emerging(1), expected(2) or exceeding(3) within each particular area. These scores are submitted to County and are used as a baseline for measuring future progress.

Learning in Willow Class...

- whole class short sessions
- adult led small group activities
 - child initiated learning known as 'explore time' (learning through 'purposeful play')
- indoor & outdoor
- daily phonics sessions / maths sessions
- Dedicated story time



How we record your child's learning...





- Learning Journey's : these are scrapbooks of your child's learning during their play. They include photographs and notes
- Writing Journey
 Book
- Maths Book

Learning to read & write...

This is the phonics scheme that we use to support early reading.
