At the recent parent forums across schools, you showed a clear interest in knowing more about our curriculum and what children are expected to learn at each age. We are introducing target sheets in Reading, Writing and Mathematics with Age Related Expectations (ARE) that are stuck in books and used to show progress. Through the year the targets will be highlighted and by the end of the year most will be met. This is good progress! Ask to see them at parents evenings (or any time you want actually) so you can see how your child is learning and progressing. Safeguarding Update 2018- Contact Numbers

We have just revised our Safeguarding Policy for Child Protection Sept 2018 in light of the changes made to the government guidelines in *Keeping Children Safe In Education 2018*. The guidelines state that schools must collect two different contact numbers for each child in case of an emergency. Please make sure you have given us two different working mobiles/landlines. Our updated policies with details for each school can be found on the website.

Homework Policy

We are developing a new homework policy across schools which should be in place by half termthe policy will have one piece of English learning set each week and one piece of Maths (with the week to complete) You are also able to read with/to your child each day – discussing what the words mean, the characters and predicting the storylines. Teachers will also be asking children to complete a learning project at home.

Attendance 2018/19

Our aim is to improve our attendance at each school so that our children enjoy more school than the national average. The National Average for attendance at school is 97% for school age pupils (YR-Y6) and currently all schools have attendance that is lower. Currently Snettisham Primary has better attendance than Heacham Schools both overall last year and this year to date – well done Snettisham!

We will invite families into school for attendance target meetings if children are falling behind with attendance (<92%) and their progress in learning. Typically children that have lower attendance have lower progress at school and the meetings will aim to support you and your child.

We may also ask you for medical evidence if your child has lower attendance and has frequent illness. Please don't be offended – this is just good practise for schools. Medical letters, appointment cards, prescribed medicines can all count as evidence.

Holidays should be requested through a letter to the Headteacher –we do not authorise holidays in term time though very occasionally an exception is made.
