


# Newsletter ~ July 2018 Snettisham Primary School





This term has been particularly busy with a residential visit to Brancaster Activity Centre, a World War II Day, Year 5 Transition Day and Sports Day, as well as many other sporting events!

Move up days were a huge success and gave pupils an opportunity to get to know their new teachers, as well as a taste of what next year has in store. Our Year 6 pupils enjoyed the time they spent at Smithdon High School too; meeting new friends and familiarising themselves with the layout of the school site.

The children have embraced their topic this term, 'Britain in the Twentieth Century' and have completed many hands on activities including 'Make Do and Mend' which entailed sewing buttons and darning holey socks! The children have also discovered how families stayed safe during the blitz, building Anderson and Morrison shelters in their homes and gardens. They designed shelters of their own and tested them for durability and flood prevention.





Birch Class end of year performance, 'The Adventures of Super Stan', was a polished performance! ## **Brancaster Residential**

One of the highlights this term was the residential trip to Brancaster Activity Centre from 20<sup>th</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup> June. Thirty of our pupils enjoyed three days of fun in the sun, throwing themselves into an exciting array of activities and rising to the challenge of trying something new.

Beans Boat Trips provided the very popular seal trip. After boarding the boat at Morston we headed up Morston Creek and out into Blakeney Harbour. There was plenty to see on our way to the seal colony, including a replica pirate ship! At the end of Blakeney Point the Common and Grey Seals were hauled out on the shingle, soaking up the sun. As well as the seals, we spotted migrating birds, including some terns with their young chicks running along the shoreline. We spent some time getting in close and turning and this gave us plenty of opportunity for photos; inquisitive seals frequently popped their heads out of the water around the boat to the delight of the children.





The children took the kayaks out in the harbour itself on the final morning of our stay. After a short demonstration they took to the water and before long the children were paddling along nicely. Our instructors set up a game of sharks and minnows and everyone enjoyed chasing each other around the harbour!





The facilities were great and the staff were very attentive. We certainly didn't go hungry; the food was top notch and there was very little food waste while we were there. The whole experience was fantastic and was enjoyed by adults and children alike.

Well another school year coming to an end. We will be losing 10 children to reception class but will hopefully have 6 new 2-year olds starting in September. We are also opening another afternoon – so 3 full days (Tues/Weds/Thurs) and 2 half days (Mon/Fri) are available from September.
